

# American vs. British English

## Introduction

This engaging matching activity helps students learn the difference between some nouns in American and British English.

## Before the Lesson

Print (A4 size), laminate, and cut out the word/picture cards. In lieu of laminating, print on thicker A4 cardstock paper. Be sure to print enough copies for the amount of students you have, for example, if you have 15 students in class, print the pdf five times and group students into threes.

## In the Lesson

Provide each group of students a set of the matching cards. Explain that they are to match the American and British cards together that have the same meaning, and match those words to the picture they belong to.

Once the students have matched all of the words/pictures, extend the activity by asking if they know which words are American English and which are British English. Ask if they know of any other words not included in the activity. Make a list on the whiteboard/blackboard/smartboard.
